BAY AREA REGIONAL ENERGY NETWORK (BAYREN)



The Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) is a collaboration of the nine counties that make up the San Francisco Bay Area.

Led by the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), BayREN implements effective energy saving programs on a regional level and draws on the expertise, experience, and proven track record of Bay Area local governments to develop and administer successful energy efficiency, climate, resource, and sustainability programs.

ABAG PUBLICLY OWNED ENERGY RESOURCES (ABAG POWER)




ABAG POWER is a voluntary, region-wide energy purchasing pool for public agencies.

Aggregated purchasing affords the opportunity to negotiate preferential pricing of energy supply for use in cost-sensitive public facilities like hospitals, police and fire stations, zoos and community centers. The natural gas purchasing pool recently completed its twenty-first year of operation and currently serves nearly 40 member agencies throughout PG&E's service territory. Program participants are guaranteed a voice in operations and decisions through its representative to the ABAG POWER Board of Directors and Executive Committee.

COMMUNITY CHOICE AGGREGATION (CCA)

CCA allows local governments to pool (or aggregate) their electricity load in order to purchase and/or develop power on behalf of their residents, businesses, and municipal accounts. Established by law in seven states thus far, CCA is an energy supply model that works in partnership with the region's existing utility, which continues to deliver power, maintain the grid, and provide consolidated billing and other customer services.
