- Organized by County
- Designed to support local planning and housing staff working on Housing Elements and related issues
- Staffed by:
 - On-call TA Expert
 - ABAG Representative
 - ABAG Meta Coordinator across all Collaboratives
- Funded by Non-Competitive REAP Grant over the next 3 years
- Must be used for REAP-eligible activities





REAP Eligible Activities

Planning that will accommodate the development of housing and infrastructure that will accelerate housing production in a way that aligns with state planning priorities, housing, transportation, equity, and climate goals.
