Exposure data for existing land use are available online at

http://quake.abag.ca.gov/mitigation/pickdbh2.html. Eight of these tables can be displayed and printed for the region (as shown on the following pages), as well as for an entire county or an individual city. For two of the tables (the California Geological Survey Seismic Hazard Maps for liquefaction and earthquake-induced landslides), the regional tables have been suppressed because the coverage is incomplete for the region. County and city data are available, however.

On line, the user can also request five types of tables -

- 1. existing (2005) land use (in acres) using 2009 hazard mapping
- 2. existing (2005) land use (in acres) using 2005 hazard mapping
- 3. existing (2000) land use (in acres) using 2005 hazard mapping (used for the 2005 MJ-LHMP)
- 4. land use change (2000-2005) (in acres) and
- 5. existing infrastructure (miles of roads, transit, rail, and pipelines).

The printouts which follow are for #3 and #4 in this list.

http://quake.abag.ca.gov/mitigation/pickcrit2010.html. This table displays critical health care facilities, city and county-owned critical facilities, bridge and road structures, and school campuses. As with the land use exposure tables, this table can be displayed and printed for the region (as shown on the following pages), as well as for an entire county or an individual city. Again, for two of the tables (the California Geological Survey Seismic Hazard Maps for liquefaction and earthquake-induced landslides), the regional tables have been suppressed because the coverage is incomplete for the region. County and city data are available, however.
