Re: Agenda Item #3: Regional Agency Joint Projects & Role of JPC

---

The JPC member agencies are engaged in many joint projects that involve different levels of coordination and integration among two or more of the agencies. This Memo and the attached Matrix that accompanies this Memo entitled “*DRAFT Current Regional Agency Joint Projects*” are intended to serve as building blocks leading up to and informing the upcoming JPC organizational planning effort. The draft Matrix provides an initial draft list of current joint projects among the regional agencies that may fall under the purview of the JPC in some capacity. These projects are organized under the work categories currently identified for the JPC, as well as by the level of integration involved among the regional agencies running from Level 1 to Level 4.

The goal of these documents is to provide a framework for the JPC for evaluating how the level of integration underway among the regional agencies on particular projects influences the role of the JPC and JPC staff on those projects over time. An important outcome as part of this process would be successfully zeroing in on the most valuable roles the JPC and JPC staff can play in helping the JPC member agencies advance projects of regional significance and using that information to establish a clear and manageable work plan for the JPC to support those outcomes.

Reaching clarity on the criteria for determining which projects of regional significance fall under the purview of the JPC, and the different roles employed by JPC staff and member agency staff in those projects will be essential to developing the Organizational Plan for the JPC and the work plan for JPC staff moving forward. The level of integration among the agencies on joint projects may very well closely correlate with the intensity of the role of the JPC and JPC staff in supporting those projects.
