Review of Planning and Construction Grant Applications for the \$3.8 Million Grant Program*

Staff / Committee

The Steering Committee will consider funding recommendations for the first batch of planning and construction grant applications received under the \$3.8 million program. Staff has reviewed and scored each project based on established Bay Trail criteria.

Illinois Street Bridge Public Access (\$250,000)

Gaffney

Consideration of a \$250,000 construction grant request from the Port of San Francisco for contribution to construction of pedestrian pathway and bike lanes on the new Illinois Street multi-modal bridge.

Sonoma Baylands Trail (\$157,550)

Consideration of a \$157,550 construction grant request from the Sonoma Land Trust for construction of a 1.6-mile separated pedestrian/bicycle pathway and amenities at the Sonoma Baylands in southern Sonoma County.

San Mateo Bay Marshes (\$142,837)

Consideration of \$142,837 grant request from the City of San Mateo for construction of a boardwalk trail and interpretive observation platform connecting the Bay Trail with the tidal marsh.

San Jose Pedestrian Bridge Study (\$95,000)

Consideration of a \$95,000 grant request from the City of San Jose for contribution to planning study components to develop a bicycle/pedestrian bridge over Alviso Slough.

Cupertino Stevens Creek Trail (\$500,000)

Consideration of a \$500,000 grant request from the City of Cupertino for construction of 1.15 miles of the Stevens Creek Trail. Bay Trail Staff is not recommending funding this project.

Shipyard 3 Construction Design (\$148,000)

Consideration of a \$148,000 planning grant request from the Port of Richmond for construction design of a 2.3-mile Bay Trail segment at Shipyard III in Richmond.

Sausalito Pathway Study (\$90,000)

Consideration of a \$90,000 planning grant request from the City of Sausalito to complete a comprehensive feasibility study and master plan for a multi-use path parallel to Bridgeway Blvd from the Sausalito Ferry terminal to the northern city border. Bay Trail Staff is not recommending funding this project.
