The outer levee has breached several times in the last decade, and the site is currently functioning as muted tidal habitat. Due to the recurrence of levee breaching and high costs of permitting and constructing a levee that would prevent future breaching, the property cannot function as managed marsh and its proposed purpose is tidal habitat restoration and habitat conservation for native fish.</p>
