

Workforce Size: **2 -100+ Employees. Average: 7.8**


SF manufacturers employ residents from across the Bay Area.




More than **75%** of the local workforce are from **low-moderate income households**. **82%** are San Francisco residents.



Close to **50%** of SFMade companies are **owned by women**.




SF Manufacturers by Age






